Mathematics

What can you do to support your child's financial literacy?

Everyday Conversations: Include children in discussions about family spending, saving for trips, or comparing prices. This makes learning natural and relatable.

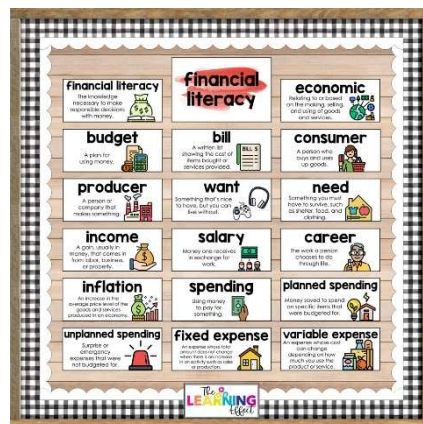
Hands-On Activities: Use allowances, piggy banks, or kid-friendly finance apps to track savings and spending. Visual progress helps children understand money management



Financial literacy for kids is the set of skills and knowledge that helps children understand money, make smart financial decisions, and develop responsible habits for the future.

What Financial Literacy Means for Kids

Financial literacy teaches children how to earn, save, spend, and manage money wisely. It goes beyond just counting coins or receiving an allowance—it includes understanding concepts like budgeting, investing, borrowing responsibly, and distinguishing between needs and wants. Learning these skills early helps kids build confidence and independence in handling money as they grow



English

In English this term we will be consolidating our learning and ensuring the children are ready to progress to secondary school.

We will achieve this by completing an extended teaching unit on narrative writing. This writing unit will extend over 3 weeks.

Writing Genre:	Fiction
Work:	Shift in viewpoint narrative
Main skills covered	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use figurative language to describe characters & setting based on a video stimulus • Use varied sentence lengths and structures • Balance speech with action • Use EAST to support writing • Include adverbials to create cohesion within the story • Show not tell • Edit and improving
Ways to help at home:	<p>Ask your children about the many different skills they can use for figurative language (ENP's, similes, metaphors, personification, etc), could they write a sentence describing their setting using one of these?</p> <p>What speech could they use to help move their story forward?</p> <p>Can they tell a well-known story from another characters perspective?</p>

Other Subjects: A lot of our time this term is taken up by rehearsing for our production 'Pirates of the Currybean', the children will learn about stage direction, tone and pace of voice whilst learning their lines and dance moved. The children will work together to make props and costumes.

Alongside our production, we will be learning about Sikh History during our history transition unit where they will explore the life of Maharaja Ranjit Singh and his influence in Punjab.

During our Art sessions, the children will create a memory sculpture in art. For PE we will be taking part in cricket sessions with Gravesham Cricket Club and we will be having swimming sessions at Cygnet Pool.

We will still be running Maths morning breakfast club.
